Tournament Program

Dates: September 27th & 28th, 2025. 1st relay firing will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, then 8:00 a.m. Sunday

Location: White Horse Center, (Google Maps) 127 White Horse Lane, Philippi, WV 26416, County Route 20/3, Crouse Road, Peeltree, WV. GPS coordinates listed on White Horse Center's Web site.

Eligibility: Open to all eligible competitors. You do not have to be an NRA member or a member of a Civilian Marksmanship Program Affiliated Club (CMP) to participate

Entry Fees: A package entry fee includes firing all three (3) stages: .22, Centerfire and .45 in the 2700 over both days of the competition. Should a competitor wish to compete in only one (1) or two (2) stages in the 2700, the entry fee will be \$25 per stage. As a CMP Sanctioned Event all EIC Leg Match entry fees are \$20, of which \$15 of each entry fee is required by the CMP

Classification: Current CMP Outdoor Precision Pistol Classification. "Competitors who do not have a CMP classification, but who have an NRA classification, may elect to compete with their current NRA classification. After a competitor establishes a CMP classification, they may continue to elect to compete with an NRA classification if it is higher than their CMP classification, but they may not compete with an NRA classification that is lower than their CMP classification." CMP Rule 3.11.6"

"Competitors who do not have a pistol classification (CMP or NRA) can compete in the Unclassified Class for their first classification, CMP Rule 3.11.7"

Awards:

- Open Winner—Mountaineer Award
- State Champion (must be a resident of WV) --- Mountaineer Award
- Special Class Awards: High Woman, High Senior & High Grand Senior & High Junior---State Champion Medal
- Aggregate Winner of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman & Unclassified---Gold Medal
- Second highest scoring High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter & Marksman---Silver Medal
- .22 Aggregate Winner, firing .22 in all three stages---Gold Medal

Open Winner & State Champion must have fired the following pistol or revolver in all 3 matches: .22, .32-45 in the center fire match & .45 in the .45 match. If a discrepancy arises between potential winners of class & special class competitors, the deciding factor will be having fired the required caliber pistol or revolver in the .22, centerfire & .45 matches, if applicable

2700 stages are: .22 caliber: Matches 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5=900 aggregate; CF Matches: 6, 7, 8, 9 & 10=900 aggregate; .45 Matches: 11, 12, 13, 14 & 15 =900 aggregate. Leg Points and Medals for the EIC Service Revolver, Service Pistol and the .22 Rimfire Matches will be provided by the CMP. EIC Achievement Pins will be awarded at the match. The award schedule for the 2700 is based on a minimum of five (5) entries per class. If less than five (5) entries, that class may be combined with the next higher class at the discretion of the Match Director, except the Master Class

Rules & Course of Fire: Current CMP Precision Pistol rules governing a CMP Tournament will apply to the 2700 and All EIC Matches. Challenge fee will be \$1 and will be returned if challenge is upheld. Challenges to posted scores must be made within the posted challenge period. Targets will be: 50-yard slow fire B-6; 25-yard timed and rapid-fire B-8. Competitors participating in the 2700 will be squared. The course of fire for each stage of the 2700 will be: 2 slow fire targets, the National Match Course, 2 timed fire targets and 2 rapid-fire targets. Course of fire for EIC Matches will be the National Match Course, except the Service Revolver Match will include 2 slow fire, 1 timed fire & 1 rapid fire target, totaling 400 possible points

Registration: Pre-registration will be accepted via U.S. Mail, with a check or money order (in U.S. funds) for all stages entered to the range capacity of 48. Pre-registration for all stages of the 2700 will receive priority then; walk-up entrants for the full 2700 then, individual stage entries will be accepted. Should entries exceed range capacity, you will be placed on a waiting list and if there are cancellations, you will be notified via text or telephone and asked if you wish to participate or cancel. When submitting your entry form, please indicate preference for 1st or 2nd relay(s); we will do our best to accommodate your choice. If there is a discrepancy regarding date of entry receipt, entry postmark will determine availability of registration and relay preference. Walk-up entries for the full 2700 to range capacity

General Information: Empty Chamber Indicators (ECIs), eye and hearing protection are mandatory. The range is equipped with electronically-timed-pneumatic-turning targets and covered firing points. Information regarding lodging accommodation appears on Page 3 **The range will be open Friday, September 26th from noon until 5:00pm for sight-in, practice, walk-up registration and camping setup.** Registration packets can be picked up at the range until 5:00pm on Friday. The .22 & Center Fire Stages and EIC .22 Caliber Leg Match will be held on Saturday, September 27th. & Sunday, September 28th. The 1st & 2nd (if needed) relay will be devoted to the .45 Stage, followed by the EIC Service Pistol & Service Revolver Matches. Should entries for the EIC Matches exceed range capacity, preference will be shown to non-distinguished competitors. Random trigger checks may be performed for the EIC Matches. A random trigger weight check of pistols & revolvers used in the 2700 may be performed

Camping: Primitive camping is available at the range, at no charge; however, no electrical, water or sewer hook-ups are available, portable toilet facilities will be available & campers must be fully self-contained

Security Services: No security services will be provided by Brassmasters or the White Horse Center. It is therefore suggested that personal valuables be kept in a secure location

Lodging: Listed below are visitors & convention bureau links to the nearby towns of Buckhannon, Bridgeport, Clarksburg and Weston, WV. Food and lodging accommodations are readily available in these towns and are approximately 20–30-minute drive from the range, depending on the location chosen

- Competitors wanting to complete the full 2700 on Saturday will be accommodated to the extent possible on a space-available basis, final decision rests with the Chief Range Officer
- All competitors will receive a 2025 State Championship Souvenir. There will be a 50/50 drawing, proceeds used to sponsor West Virginia State Association Pistol Teams at the National Matches
- The Tournament Sponsor reserves the right to make changes to the Tournament Program including relay starting times, squadding of competitors, combine competitors to fill vacant positions on any stage or relay and other changes that it deems are in the best interest of the tournament, consistent with current CMP rules
- Competitors are expected to be at the Ready Line and prepared to occupy their assigned firing point on the firing line 15 minutes before their relay is called to the Firing Line. Should a competitor fail to occupy their assigned position on the Firing Line when their relay is called, their assigned position will be given to a competitor assigned to another relay, but ready. The 1st Relay will begin firing promptly at 9:00a.m. on Saturday and 8:00 a.m. on Sunday. Relay/stage starting & ending times are approximate
- Pre-registration is strongly encouraged to reserve your entry and select the relay you wish to enter. All competitors will be squadded. Competitors wanting to fire the full 2700 on the first day will be accommodated to the extent possible.
- This tournament will only be delayed or stopped for the following reason(s) lightning in the area or targets repeatedly blow out of target holders. Should the tournament be stopped, winners and awards will be determined by scores of all matches of the 2700 completed before stoppage. No refunds for uncompleted matches or to those failing to fire (DNF) in matches entered
- **Food & Refreshments: Breakfast (both days) will be on your own; however, lunch, snacks & refreshments will be available from a private food vendor Saturday. Refreshments will be available on Sunday & sandwiches can be delivered from a local deli**
 - Walk up Registration and Registration Packets will be available at the range on Friday, September 26th from noon till 5:00pm. The range will be open for sight-in/practice on Friday September 26th noon till 5:00pm. Main Gate locks at 8:00pm
